Julie has been appointed as Assistant Curate (Deanery Enabler) for the Isle of Axeholme. The daughter of a British soldier Julie spent her early and teenage years travelling around Britain and the world before finally settling in Godalming in Surrey where she met and married her husband Graham. She enjoys working with young people and in addition to being a teacher and academy chaplain she is also Chaplain to the St. Lawrence Academy Combined Cadet Force and leads a Youth Emmaus group, a joint initiative between St. Lawrence Academy and church.
