Identify your gifts as your gifts will match your calling.

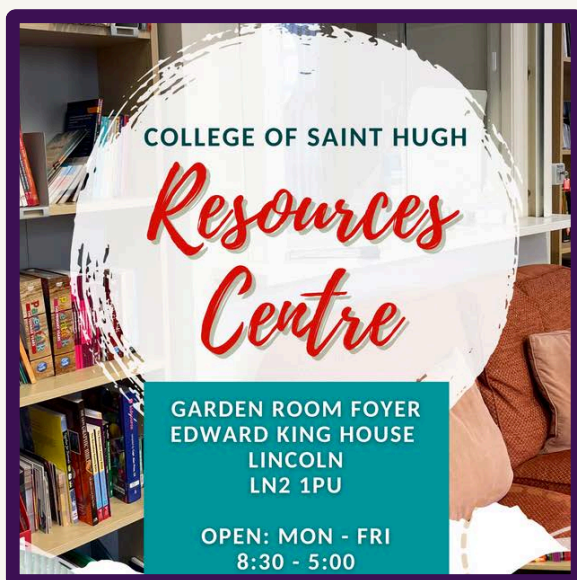

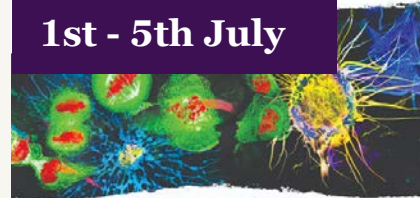

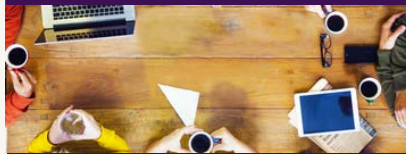

Organisations can sign up by filling out this [form](#). This could include churches in your diocese, or even your diocese itself. A church would probably need agreement via the PCC. But even if the PCC is not meeting in the 6 weeks before the election, it is still worth signing up later. After the election, decisions will be made about which Bills are brought forward, so it will still be important to show support. [More information.](#)

Quick Wins Grant (Net Zero Carbon 2030)

The Church of England Environment Programme has generously provided the Diocese of Lincoln with over £65k to distribute to our churches. The fund we could give to your church would support small and quick actions that reduce energy and cut your carbon footprint. We're giving away up to £3000 (and in exceptional circumstances up to £10,000).

Grants and Funding

Through the work of the Bishop of Lincoln, a range of grants are available to be applied for by individuals, parishes, schools, Parish Partnerships, Local Mission Partnerships and church organisations across the Diocese of Lincoln. These grants range from £100 to £20,000 and are made to advance wellbeing, to encourage local projects that support a strategy for growth, particularly where there is insufficient local income or reserves to pay for them.
